

MARINE OPERATIONS APPRENTICESHIP

(Boatmaster Apprenticeship Level 3) Cory is one of the UK's leading resource management, recycling, and energy recovery companies. The Marine Operations Apprenticeship is 2 years in duration, aimed at achieving industry-recognised qualifications and will be delivered in conjunction with a recognised and approved training body. You will have the opportunity to learn through block-release at college and transfer the skills in a working environment with support from workplace mentors and buddies.

Based at our Barge Yard in Charlton, the Marine Operations Apprenticeship will support the team afloat by:

- Assisting the Captain, Mate and crew and following all instructions to ensure a safe and efficient towage operation on our tugs and barges.
- Assisting with ship husbandry
- Achieving all required qualifications

Through a mixture of college (some residential attendance required) and on-site training, skills will be developed in the following areas:

- Working within the company's health, safety, environmental and quality framework.
- Hazard awareness and emergency actions.
- General seamanship and local knowledge.
- Tug operations and on-board equipment.
- Use of tools.



Overview of the role

Through practical and vocational studies, obtain work-related professional gualifications to act as part of a boat crew who are responsible for the safe and effective delivery of waste to our energy from waste plant.

You will be expected to attend college and complete course work to a high standard.

You will complete the Level 3 Boatmaster apprenticeship at an industry-leading apprenticeship academy to gain a Tier 1, Level 2 Boatmaster licence with the opportunity to achieve further licence endorsements.

36 hours per week (shift-based Monday to Friday with occasional Saturday working)

Salary approximately £14,000 per annum

Subsistence provided whilst studying at the training provider
